Ghamma is normally pronounced G as in 2 sloc (A-gios = Holy)

It is pronounced GH as in Јaврıнд (Ghavriel = Gabiel) (arabic letter Ghen) if followed by any of the vowels: d.G.I.H.r

It is pronounced NG as in dsseגoc (Angelos = Angel) If there are two consecutive ss the first is pronounced $N$, and the second is $G$
